Catherine Kavanaugh, MA Stanford



Catherine Kavanaugh recognizes the multidisciplinarity of the Design Thinking process as the particularly defining attribute that allows for disruption of patterns. She came to social innovation by way of the Hasso Plattner Institute for Design at.

Stanford (d.School) and the Stanford Graduate School of Education, where she focused on Cognitive Development and the many ways in which we learn. Prior to attending Stanford, Kavanaugh produced films and a touring international film festival to engage learners with their peers around the world. Her research investigates autobiographical memory and its impact on decision making. She brings with her a deep understanding of how team cohesion and creative confidence enables native innovation.

She has worked with project partners including PepsiCo, Gray Area, Lucile Packard Children's Hospital, Fidelity Savings and Hermann Miller with Peking University and the Central Academy of Fine Art in Beijing. As guest lecturer at the Hasso Plattner Institut für Software Systematic - School of Design Thinking, she coached graduate students for project partners including SAP, Janssen & Janssen, Babelsberg Filmpark and served as producer for the first international Design Thinking conference, the d.Confestival.

In 2014, she was guest expert for Design Thinking Week presented by Top 500 Innovators of Poland and the American Embassy, Poland. Introduced to Kazakhstan through the Silicon Valley Innovation Center, she delivered Design Thinking to the Nazarbayev School, Astana and in 2017 to professors, administrators and NGOs through Almaty Management University in Almaty and Aktau.
